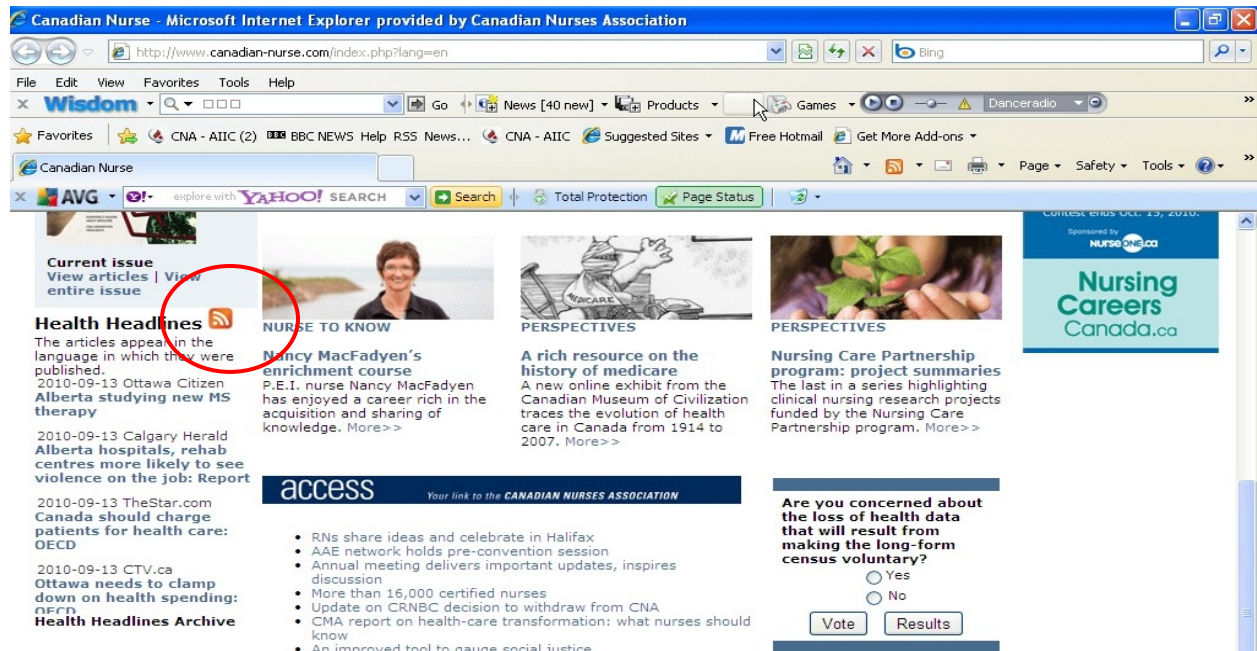


# Health Headlines RSS feed FAQ

## Q. How do I subscribe to the Health Headlines RSS feed?

A. Visit [Canadian Nurse](http://www.canadian-nurse.com) and click the orange RSS feed icon beside Health Headlines. A new window will open with subscription information. Detailed instructions follow.

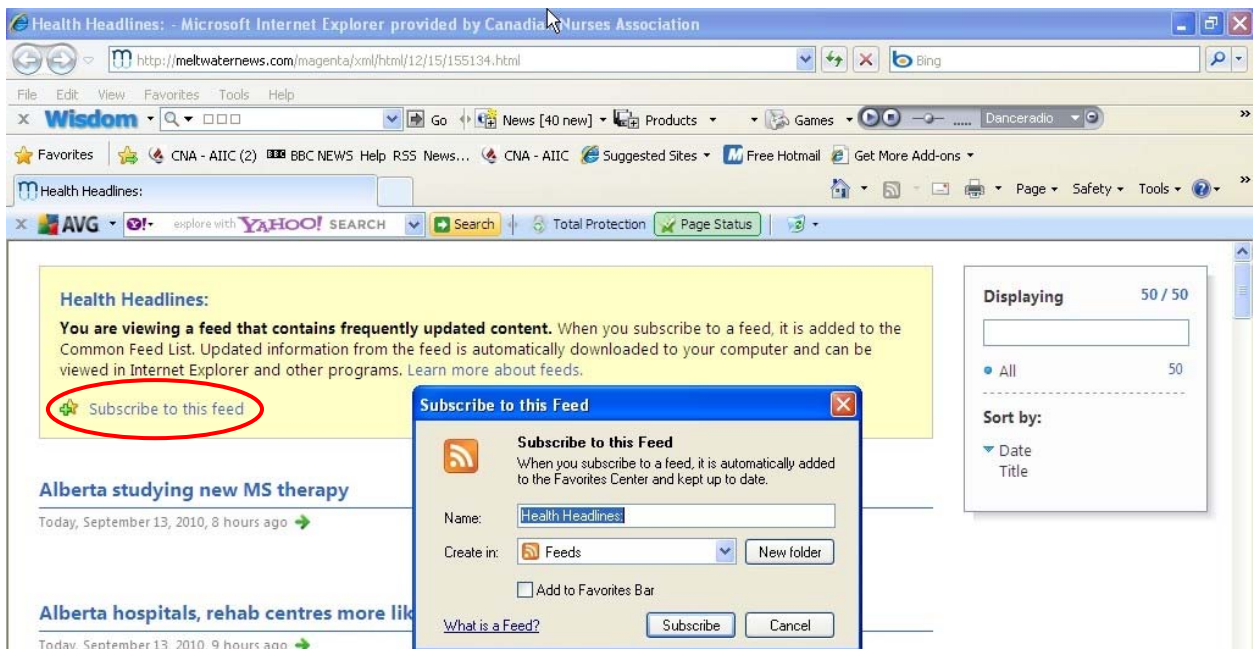
1. Visit [Canadian Nurse](http://www.canadian-nurse.com) and click the orange RSS feed icon.



2. Click **Subscribe to this feed**. A new window will open.

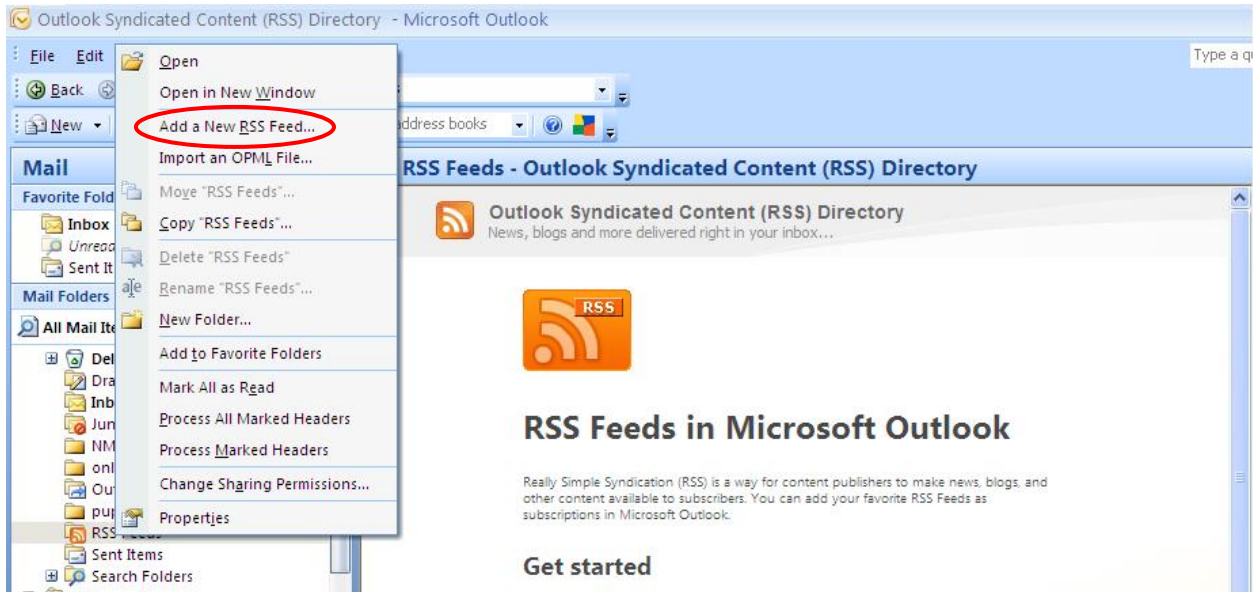
**Tip:** If necessary, name the RSS feed “Health Headlines.” We recommend you do not change the name.

### 3. Click **Subscribe**.



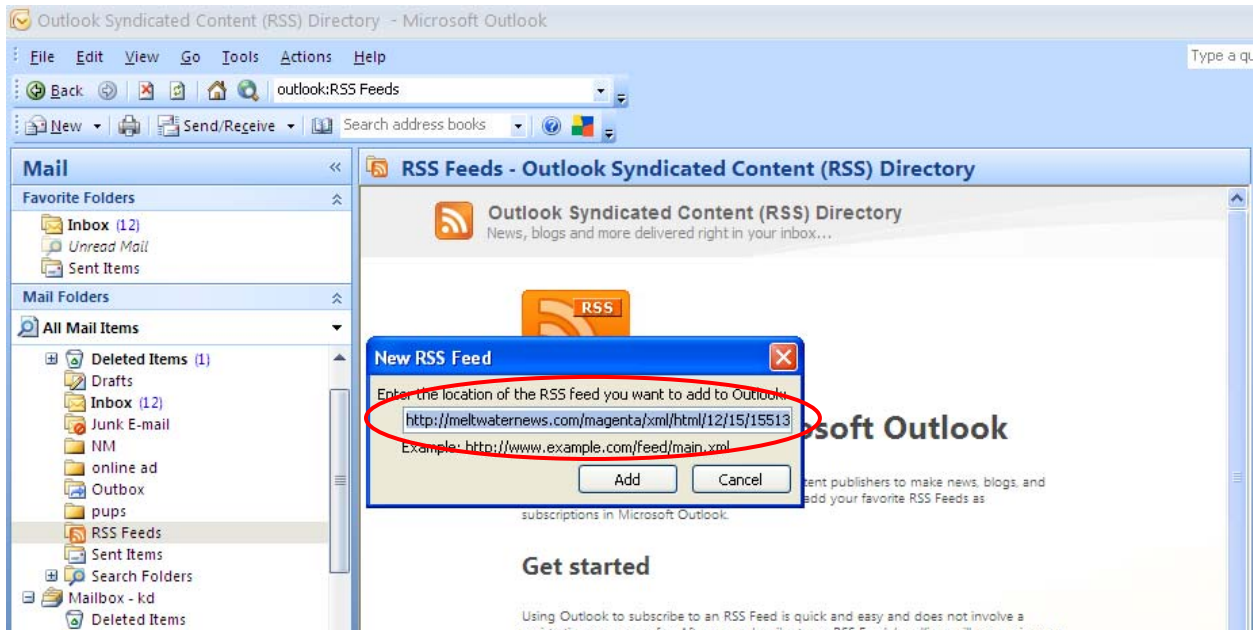
### Q. How do I receive the Health Headlines RSS feed via Microsoft Outlook?

- A. After you subscribe to Health Headlines, if it does not appear in your **RSS Feeds** folder in Outlook, follow these instructions.
  1. Open Outlook.
  2. Right click the **RSS Feeds** folder.
  3. Click **Add a New RSS Feed**. Leave the **New RSS Feed** window open.
  4. Visit [Canadian Nurse](http://CanadianNurse.com) and click the orange RSS feed icon next to Health Headlines. A new Health Headlines window will open.



5. Copy the Health Headlines URL  
(<http://meltwaternews.com/magenta/xml/html/12/15/155134.html>)

6. Paste the URL into the **New RSS Feed** window.

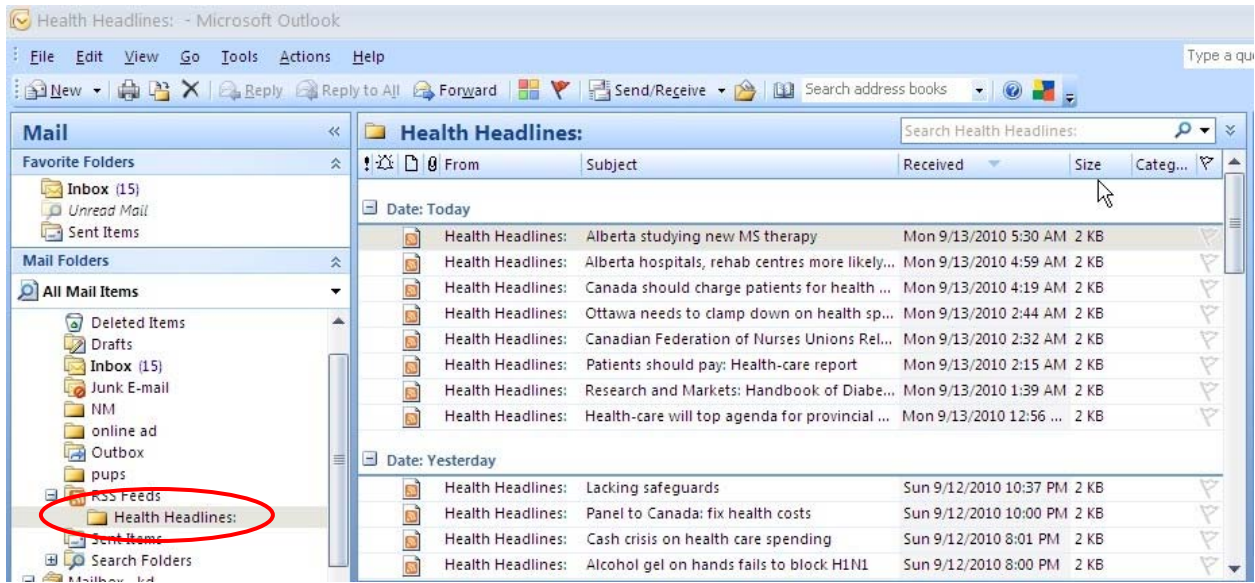


7. Click **Add**.

**Q. How do I view the Health Headlines RSS feed?**

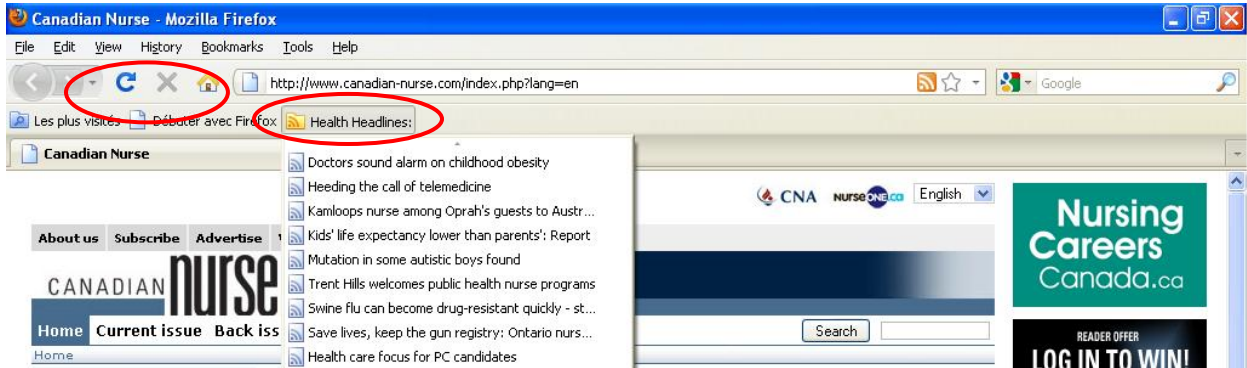
**Microsoft Outlook**

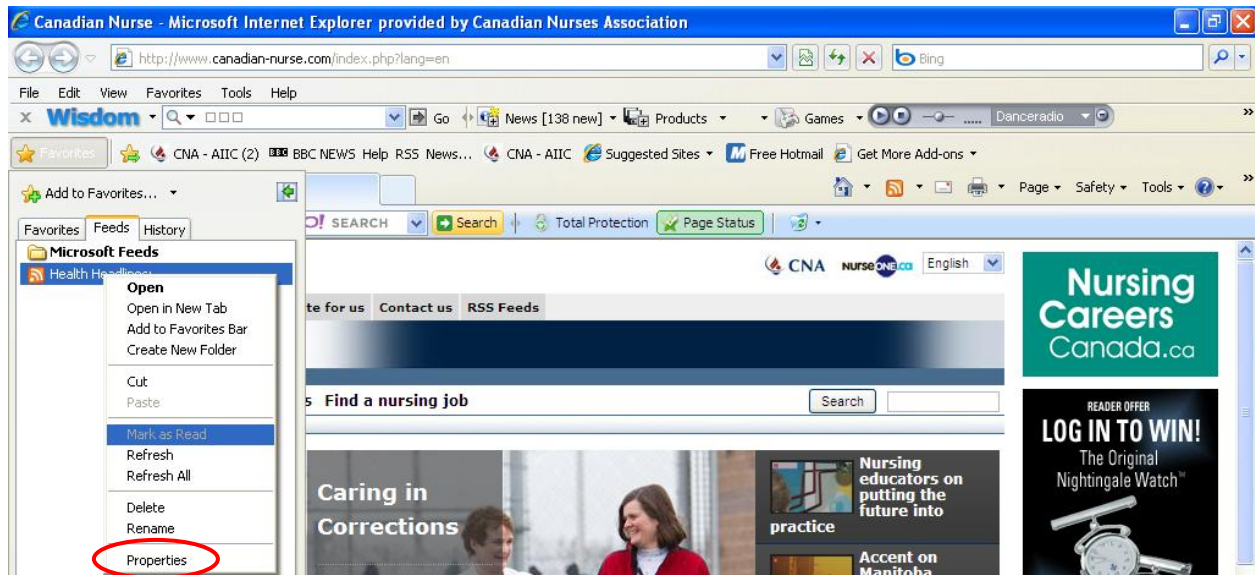

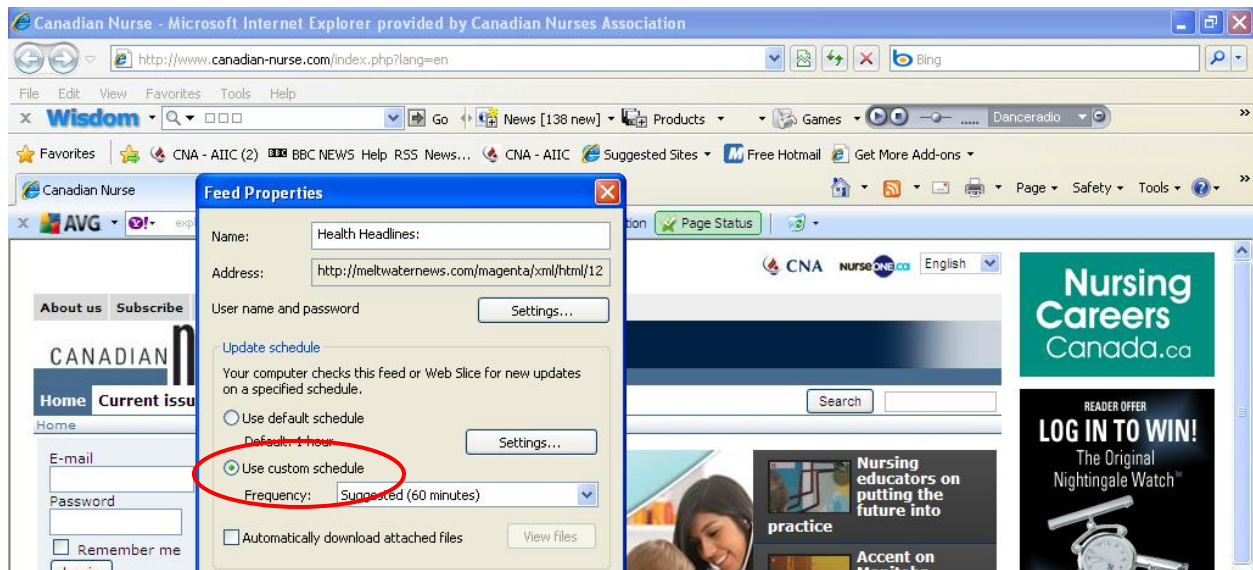
**Q: How do I adjust the frequency of the Health Headlines RSS feed?**

**A:** You must change the Health Headlines RSS feed properties if you want to adjust the frequency of news updates. The following are detailed instructions for Internet Explorer (other browsers will be slightly different).

1. Click **Favorites**.
2. Click the **Feeds** tab.
3. Right click **Health Headlines** and select **Properties**



4. Select **Use custom schedule**.



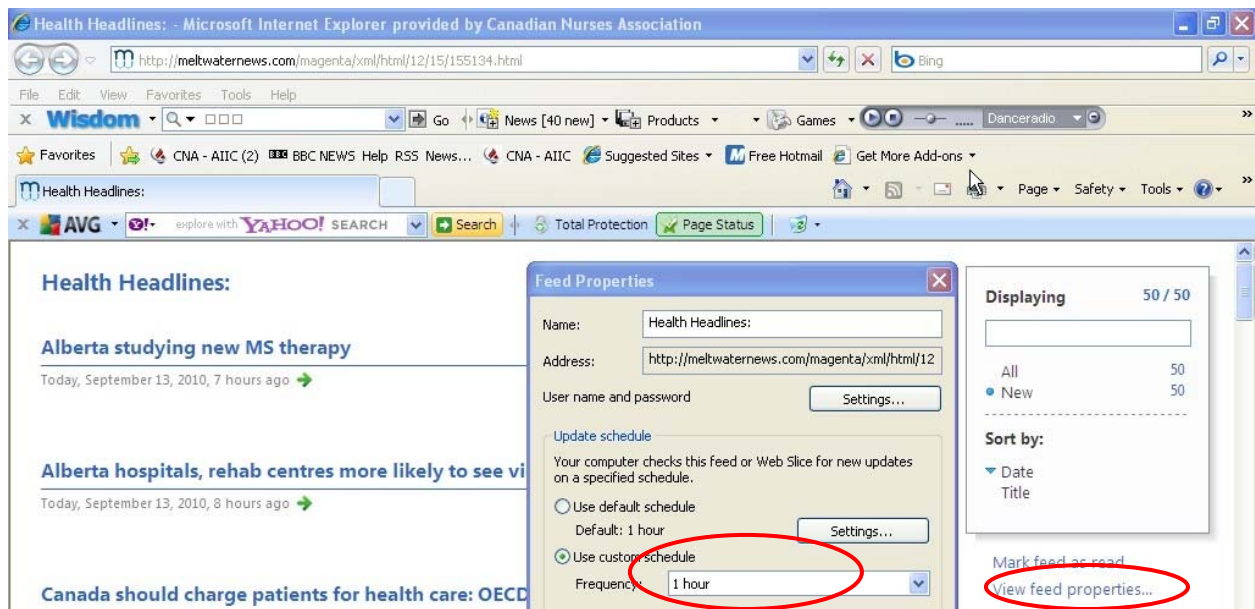
5. Select your desired frequency of updates
